
P-R-E-F-A-C-E

Shanghai Urban Space Art Season (SUSAS) is a major urban space art exhibition event held every two years.

Adhering to the concept of "Culture Enriches City, Art Enlightens Space", SUSAS is designed to establish a brand in urban space art events that features "internationality, publicity, and practicality", and in turn improves the quality of urban spaces and elevate the city's appeal. Exhibitions and sites are interconnected where the urban construction sites are introduced into exhibitions, and the achievements of exhibition are applied into the practice. The aim of each SUSAS is to boost a cultural hot spot, accumulate a treasure of masterpieces by artists around the world, and beautify a number of urban public spaces.

SUSAS 2017 is hosted by Shanghai Urban Sculptures Committee, and organized by Shanghai Municipal Bureau of Planning and Land Resources, Shanghai Municipal Administration of Culture, Radio Film&TV, and People's Government of Pudong New Area. The main venue is the silo of 80,000 tons at Minsheng Port, Pudong New Area and surrounding open spaces. The event lasts three months from 15 October, 2017 to 15 January, 2018. The theme of main exhibition is "this CONNECTION: Sharing a Future Public Space". The primary curators are Stefano Boeri, Li Xiangning and Fang Zhenning. The main exhibition contains four theme exhibitions and twelve special pavilions involving more than two hundred items and nearly two hundred domestic or overseas planners, architects, artists. Besides, eight site projects and six joint exhibitions are held all over the city. Over a hundred USAS academic activities and other public activities are planned during the three months.

Project Introduction

"Better Community, Better Life — Site Project of Pudong Colorful Community" is a site project based on the planning of Pudong Colorful Community, and is of great importance for autonomy, multi-governance, bottom-to-top and other urban revitalizing approaches which are closely related to the life of citizens. Targeted at "micro-revitalization" of five sub-district communities in Pudong New Area, the Colorful Community is a program led by the People's Government of Pudong New Area, Shanghai, involving Shanghai Urban Planning and Design Research Institute and other art/design institutions. The five communities are: Lujiazui, Yangjing, Weifang, Tangqiao and Huamu. Nine events have been initiated under the guidance of professionals and authorities. The plan reflects the district government's heartfelt concern for the welfare of citizens, improves the environment and context of and around the communities, and realizes the notion of "sharing" in the levels authorized according to laws and regulations.

Xi Wenqin

Xi Wenqin, senior engineer, is the director at No. 2 planning Dept. and Historical Cultural and Public Space Art Center. She has participated in or led more than 200 planning, design or research projects, and won a number of national or municipal awards of planning or design. In recent years, she has focused on the work around the World Expo, the protection of people's livelihood, heritage culture. Her awarded projects include "The Bund Waterfront Building Detailed Planning" (2009 National Outstanding Planning and Design Award); "Hengshan Road – Fuxing Road Historical and Cultural Heritage Protection Plan" (first prize, Shanghai Municipal Planning and Design Award). She was the curator of Shanghai Special Exhibition, which was part of the main exhibition of SUSAS 2015.



Xu Jirong

Xu Jirong, who graduated from Tongji University in 2013, acquired a master degree in Urban Planning, worked in Shanghai urban planning and Design Institute in September in the same year, now works at No. 2 planning Dept. She has participated in and led various planning, design and research projects, with experience as planner and designers. In 2010, she contributed to "The Old's Happiness", which won the first prize of National Outstanding Social Investigation Reportsof Urban Planning Students. She helped curating the Shanghai Special Exhibition, which was part of the main exhibition of SUSAS 2015.



Yang Fan

Yang graduated from UCL Bartlett School of Architecture, acquired a master degree, and has been working in No.2 Planning Department, Shanghai Urban Planning and Design Institute since March 2013.

Theme Interpretation

"Better Community, Better Life —Site Project of Pudong Colorful Community" is intended to showcase and promote the colorful community project. As the requirements on community planning increases gradually, the weakness of community development is getting apparent: lack of community sense and humane touch, poor quality of public space, insufficient public facilities, unsatisfying non-motorized traffic system, and silent city cultural activities, etc. The exhibition invites engagement of various parties, tries to connect people and community, in the hope that the activities will show the target of colorful community, "Meticulous design, Community Fusion, Lighting up Life".



Project Introduction

The Beixinjing community is located in the middle–northern area of Changning District, enveloped by Xinyugang (new fishing port), Songhong Road, Suzhou Creek, YuanfengTianshan Garden, West Tianshan Road and Beihong Road. The 140.35 hectare region has its root in Beixinjing Town, which was founded more than seven hundred years ago. Currently, most part of Beixinjing consists of old residential communities. Its environment calls for improvement, and amenities and public spaces for events are in lack of energy. In the last two years, the administration office has initiated "micro–revitalization" projects to improve the environment and amenities in a targeted manner. Until October 2017, 22 projects have been completed, covering urban system renewal (medium renovation and landscape transformation of West Tianshan Road), urban public space renovation (renovation of street corner square at Pingtong Road and Jinzhong Road, etc.), community amenities renewal (renovation of three pavilions in No.7 Xinjing Village, etc.) and public art projects (wall renovation of Jinzhong Road, etc.) "Xinjing · New Scape , Site Project of Urban Regeneration in Beixinjing, Changning" is a comprehensive collection and display of the pilot micro–revitalization projects.

Zhang Jiajing

Zhang Jianjing is founder and principal architect of Atelier GOM. He is guest lecturer in Shanghai Jiao Tong University, board member of Shanghai City Planning Expert Committee. His works include Long Nan Jia Yuan public rental housing, Fu Lin Jia Yuan public rental housing, De Fu middle school in Jiading, Community Center in New Jiangwan. He has curated PSA "Spectacle: 12 Presentations of Contemporary Museum Architectures in China", photography exhibition in Studio MOA, West Bund. His works have been exhibited in Milan Triennale, MOCA architecture space art exhibition, and Shenzhen/Hong Kong UABB, etc.



Zhou Jianjia

Zhou Jianjia is founder and principal architect of YeArch Studio, guest lecturer of Tongji University, guest lecturer of Hong Kong University Shanghai Study Center. She rethinks and responds to the contemporary condition of Chinese cities via architecture, drawing, writing and installation. Her works have been exhibited on Open Your Space, 2015 SUSAS, Shenzhen/Hong Kong UABB, "NYC x Design: Nature/Architecture", Chengdu Biennale, etc.

Theme Interpretation

"Xinjing· New Scape" attempts to echo the main theme "thisCONNECTION: Sharing a Future Public Space" from three aspects: infrastructure, say, roads and bridges, that closes physical ruptures in urbanity; revitalizing the existing modes of communal space; and promoting the dialogue between citizens and urban topics. "Xinjing· New Scape" echoes "thisCONNECTION" in terms of physical structures and life style alike, which itself is a channel, leading the concept of urban space into the sphere of community.

This exhibition will demonstrate the practices conducted by Beixinjing Sub-district Office, whose latest experiments are new pilot projects launched in 2017. These movements bring a new context and perspective to Beiixnjing area, and inspire the theme of this exhibition, that is "Xinjing. New Scape".

After two years of exploration, we believe the topic of regeneration should be extended from the renovation of micro public amenities to the construction of urban system, by introducing issues closely related to everyday life, such as street section, road section, public facilities. Due to the typicality embodied in Beixinjing area, the exhibition will open a fresh observation distance and perspective.

Exhibition

Site Project Regeneration in Beixinjing, Changning is composed of three parts, namely "Urban Regeneration in Xinjing", "Exhibition in Community" and "Academy in Everyday Life". "Urban Regeneration in Xinjing" highlights conceptions and implementations at two scales: communal amenities and urban system. The communal part summarizes the pilot projects conducted in Beixinjing from 2016 to 2017, including revamping of Jinzhong Rd and Pingtang Rd street corner, communal center in Xinjing 5th New Village, etc; while the other, which is broader and more general, switches to urban systems, which includes the proposals for West Tianshan Rd renovation and comprehensive upgrade of Beixinjing Area. "Exhibition in Community" stands for the idea that this exhibition is placed in everyday life with a pedestrian route that connects all pilot projects and the opening /closing ceremonies, among others, that are integrated into the Beixinjing communal space. Several forums, performances and outdoor events constitute "Academic in Everyday Life", where local residents, researchers and professionals of urban planning, architecture, community empowerment are invited to contribute their thoughts on a range of topics.

It is worth mentioning that, the main venue of Site Project Regeneration — Changning Folk Culture Center will be under renovation during exhibition. Being another site of urban regeneration, it becomes the microcosm of the whole progress.



Urban Micro Intervention: Musicify the Community ——Site Project of Shanghai Music Valley Hongkou

Project Introduction

As a continuation of Hongkou Site Project in SUSAS 2015, and Let's work Project in 2016, this 2017 project chooses its site at Music Valley and Tilanqiao, and professionals from College of Design and Innovation, Tongji University and renowned architecture offices are involved. The focal points of Music Valley area include promoting a musical maker industry, and micro-renovation of the Sanjiaodi (literally triangular field, formerly Hongkou Market). An immersive community museum is built, and a well-designed pedestrian service system is established to make Music Valley a better community. In order to collect first-hand materials of the transformation and renovation of Music Valley Community, a series of community surveys are planned. The synagogue, houses, shops, schools and other footprints of Jewish presence in Tilanqiao Historical and Cultural Landscape are revitalized and activated, enhancing the unique historical and cultural appeal of Hongkou District, and Shanghai in general.





Dai Chun

Initiator of "Micro Urban Space Revival Plan". Founder of "Let's talk FORUM". Operating director and executive editor of Time+Architecture. Founder of Archiepos Studio.



Yu Ting

Leading architect of Wutuopia Lab. Guest professor of Southeast University. Initiator of "Micro Urban Space Revival Plan". Founder of "Let's talk FORUM".

Theme Interpretation

"Micro Urban Space Revival Plan" aims to find social-aware designers to "discover and study the lost spaces in city, and do design", so as to activate "negative" spaces, make our communities, where we live, more positive and energetic. It also turns these "lost" spaces into essential platforms of private or public life of citizens, arousing sense of belonging in them. A number of middle-age or younger architects have stood out in response. As a continuation of the 2015 slogan, "Small Step, Big Change", the 2017 projects holds "Micro Intervention, Macro Improvement" as the guiding principle, introducing experimental design and art thinking into public space planning while extending isolated sites into an interactive, participatory grid of space art.





Exhibition

Music Valley

- 1. A well-designed pedestrian service system starts from the entrance pavilion, installs community VI and various information interfaces, contributing to a beautified and connected community. The system further extends to connect the two exhibition areas, Music Valley and North Bund, and will gradually improve the walking experience on the route.
- 2. A series of community surveys are planned to collect first-hand materials in the transformation and renovation of Music Valley, and their results will be incorporated into the community museum. Music Valley is a complicated mixture of historical buildings, creativity industrial park, large office towers, and typical Lilong. Its past, present and future are worthy of careful study and documentation. Aligned with the pedestrian tour system, a community museum whose permanent administrative and info center is placed in the Sanjiaodi, will be "immersed" into the general picture in a manner featuring micro intervention, network approach. The museum is a participatory element integrated into the community.
- 3. The experience hall and Akihabara Street are intended to attract SNH 48 fans, and appeal to the lifestyle of "New-new Generation". They also serve the community and its residents at large, while revitalize the business atmosphere.
- Retain installments on the roadside façade, create waterfront sceneries, illuminating the whole area with these highlight sites.

Tilangiao Community

- Lilong Medium Renovate empty houses in the community, and introduce new functions, such as creativity parks, and demonstrative studios. Self-inspired changes are particularly encouraged. In the meanwhile, these structures are expected to serve seniors and children with, for instance, libraries and play rooms.
- 2. From 2D to 3D What is expected of the renovated gates doesn't stay on a collection of planes, but should be a three-dimensional transformation, where the gates function as central pieces. The spaces will be rearranged in a holistic manner, taking roadside façade into consideration.

Pocket parks — the unauthorized plants will be removed to make room for accessible community public spaces. Despite the lack in economic benefits, the tiny urban parks are mini oxygen cylinder for urban people, inviting window shoppers, nearby residents and young people to sit, read, listen to music or play skateboard... They are serene domains amongst a buzzling world.

3. "One Shop One Product" Program — breaking away with traditional renovation approach, "One Shop One Product" is adopted. Palette is unified, and the presence of brand is reflected in logo and shop layout. Individualized design and improved environment are emphasized.





Project Introduction

Shanghai West Bund is an urban branding and development project that aims to build upon the cultural and commercial foundation of the Xuhui waterfront. West Bund covers a total area of 9.4 square kilometers in the southwest part of the Xuhui District, including 11.4 kilometers of shoreline. The area stretches from Rihui Port in the north to Huangpu River in the east, and Wanping Rd, Longhua Rd, and Longwu Rd in the west. It neighbors the Longhua Historic Conservation Area and faces the Shanghai World Expo Site, with Houtan Park across the river. West Bund's 9.4 square kilometers of land represent the largest developable area on either side of the Huangpu River.

Shanghai West Bund is an ambitious development project that seeks to bring domestic and foreign leaders together in the fields of culture, art, media, fashion, design, and innovative finance to create a unique, world-class waterfront on par with the Left Bank in Paris and the South Bank in London.

Chen An'da

As a veteran of cultural industry, Chen has experiences in investment, operation and management of cultural industry projects, as well as planning and operation of major cultural events. He received Shanghai Youth Award in 2012. Chen is the head of Project Promotion Department, West Bund Group. His primary responsibilities include introducing and operating cultural industry project, planning and operating major cultural events, and promoting businesses related to duty-free artwork transaction in Riverfront, Xuhui. In his current position, he has planned and organized West Bund Music Festival (2013-2016), West Bund Art & Design Expo (2014-2016), West Bund: A Biennial of Architecture and Contemporary Art (2013), Waterfront Global Talk (2016) and Art West Bund (2016-2017); helped organize SUSAS 2015, Shanghai Art & Design 2016; and helped prepare the construction of landmark institutions, such as West Bund Art Center and West Bund Culture and Art Pilot



Ye Ke'yang

After receiving his degree of urban planning in Tongji University almost a decade ago, Ye joined the enterprise of developing Riverfront, Xuhui, particularly planning and administration of area development projects. As the head of Planning and Management Department, West Bund Group, his primary responsibilities include positioning research (e.g., the functional research of Xuhui Riverfront Core Zone), documentation of area planning projects (e.g., the implementation plan of West Bund Public Open Space) and key project design (e.g., West Bund Media Port); helped plan West Bund: A Biennial of Architecture and Contemporary Art (2013); and contributed to Shanghai Street Design Guidelines.



Yang Dan

Yang has a master degree of architectural of Politecnico di Milano and one of Tongji University. As a commissioner of Planning and Management Department, West Bund Group, Yang has helped organize West Bund: A Biennial of Architecture and Contemporary Art 2013, Bi-city Biennale of Urbanism\Architecture 2013, Milano Animal City 2016, Waterfront Global Talk 2016, ART WEST BUND 2016–2017, and other programs.

Theme Interpretation

The theme "Dual Radiation" is borrowed from literary techniques. In the context of literature, dual radiation refers to the attempt to capture the natural environment and the characters' personalities in a bi-directional radiative relationship, where both elements support, reflect and assimilate each other. It is about sublimating the story in terms of contents, aesthetics and sentiments by forging humans, objects and plots into a delicate, harmonious and integral whole, instead of leaving these features scattered and separated. Going through the history and prospect of West Bund, the idea struck us that the public space and public of West Bund, with their connections, interactions, reflections and radiations, constitute an organically growing dual radiation, where human, city, space and time all find their artistic, scientific, sociological and futuristic expressions.

Exhibition

During the art season, we will make joint efforts with peer exhibitions and events to raise the public consciousness of issues like management of waterfront public spaces, art in public spaces and preservation of industrial heritages. The most important exhibited items include: Star Gallery, Runway Park, Oil Tank Art Park and ten pieces of public art in the Public Open Space.


The walls surrounding Star Gallery and Oil Tank Art Park, which are under construction, and Runway Park, which is only completed, will play the role of panels, telling the designs, concepts, highlights and renderings of these projects in text, graphic and multi-media. Putting individual projects in the big picture of urban renewal, this exhibition is inviting the public to witness and participate in this process.

As part of a joint event with other SUSAS exhibitions and cultural events, this exhibition will install ten superior pieces of public art around West Bund Open Public Space, guiding the visitors through a narrative, radiative network of routes, displaying the history, daily life, physical space and cultural meanings of West Bund in a holistic manner. The exhibition also aims to arouse an immersive, reflexive, experiences on the part of each visitor, against the cultural context of this site.



Project Introduction

Completed in 2015, T20 Building (formerly West Asia Hotel) is located at No. 20 Tianyaoqiao Road, bordering Zhaojiabang Road (North), Tianyaoqiao Road (East), Metro Tower and Huilian Mall, and Metrocity (West). It covers 0.21 hectare, with building area of 2,400 m2 and height of 70m. The building contains a variety of functions. The underground retail space constitutes part of the Metro Station Retail Square. The first and second floors are public open spaces, and the second floor is connected to Second Shanghai Department Store, Huijin Department Store, Metrocity and Pacific Digital Plaza via "covered bridges", which further form passable "Sky Garden" with green belts and entertainment facilities above ground. The third to fifth floors are for parking and equipment. The sixth and above are 5A office spaces.

Theme Interpretation



Starting from the moment Xu Guangqi introduced European sciences and faith into China, it ends up a region of cutting-edge landmarks, like Metrocity, Buynow Plaza and Shanghai Indoor Stadium. Science, locality, fashion all contribute their due parts to what is now known as Xujiahui. If we may say that construction renews the outer appearance of a city, then cultural development is the core of its evolution. Either one is the corroboration and background of the other. As the old and new buildings mingle in the same area, the renewed Xujiahui is expected to offer a myriad of spaces, and a future of variability.



Exhibition

This site project is held on the second floor of T20 Building, a half-open public space that is closely related to citizens' life. Considering the existing conditions of urban construction and cultural development, this project adopts exhibition and serial events to showcase a number of site cases in Xujiahui urban space, and art works composed by a variety of creators, so as to attract public attention on urban space, art and humanistic development, and make the city a more dynamic and elegant place. The curator team arranges the exhibition space based on the minimalist prototype of "Excircle of square", creating a harmonious and penetrative layout. The project is engaged in a dialogue with the real site by pictures, documents, models and videos of the site placed around the building and facing the city. On the other hand, as the epitome of transcendental "Culture" and "Civilization", the works of artists are placed in the inner circle, and the diversified perspectives reflect the irreducible, and yet fundamentally harmonious heterogeneity of cultures. Art enlightens the city, and is accommodated by the city.

"Purple Roof" has successfully organized "Jing'an International Sculpture Project" in 2010, 2012, 2014 and 2016, and it is the key curatorial and executive team of the sculptural section of Shanghai Art Fair for eight consecutive years from 2007 to 2014.

Theme Interpretation

Double exposure is a photography jargon, which means that superimposing two images on one film by exposing it twice. A profound and historical transformation is underway of a factory which houses manufacturing machinery and strengthens the city's tangible forces to Jing'an Innovation Galaxy Site which provides intangible, that is, spiritual and cultural, values and services to the public. Breaking through the old–fashioned exhibition model as guided by educated professionals, two flash activities will be held at the old Shanghai Metallurgical Mining Machinery Factory and the renovated Jing'an Innovation Galaxy in October and December 2017 with a common theme "double exposure, the factory rebirth". They will show the public how values miles and decades apart may co–exist in a temporal–spatial unity.











Exhibition

Focusing on the theme "Double Exposure Factory Rebirth", Jing'an Innovation Galaxy will launch two sessions of Art Exhibitions, that is, "We Workers Have Power" (October 2017) and "We All Have Power" (January 2018), together with participatory and interactive art installations, art markets and music parties. These localized public events are designed to inspire visitors with the concept that art transforms and sublimates our beloved city.

The activities in October will combine art installations, art market and outdoor movies in a retrospective sub-theme "We Workers Have Power". Inspired by industrial waste materials, the artists have create various forms of new media art including land art, neon sign installation and voice installation. This immersed industrial experience will connect people with space and history. The 50-vendor art market features experience and participation rather than buying and selling .Combining vintage and modernism, the market will introduce to its visitors a wide range of activities, such as worker's canteen, art workshops, traditional handicraft and outdoor movies, compacting generations of memories into a single place. In 6 January, empowered by new functions of the space, another sub-theme "We All Have the Power" will take over, offering events with elements of film culture and performing arts as the connective medium, so as to motivate public involvement. It will also reshape the perception of Jing'an Innovation Galaxy as a film/cultural base through experimental drama, interactive street shows and unique "crowd-involved" music festival in the renewed "factory".

Project Introduction

The Yueyang road in Tianping Street, Xuhui district is situated at the south end of Hengshan Road–Fuxing Road Historical and Cultural Landscape, which is a Class 1 preservation road. Tianping Street Community lies in the northeast of Xuhui District, bordering South Shaanxi Road (East), Tianping Street and Huashan Road (West), Zhaojiabang Road (South), Middle Huaihai Road and Middle Fuxing Road (North). The 26,800 m2 area contains multiple Class 1 preservation roads, protected historical and cultural sites, and excellent historical buildings, making it one of the representative region of West sector of Shanghai French Concession. The Biennial includes Landscape Photography Exhibition, History & Culture Exhibition, Celebrities of Tianping Street, Interactive Design Music Show, etc. A more direct relationship between people and objects will be delivered through artistic language installed in public space. In the photography exhibition, 100 excellent works reflecting this Shanghai landscape area will be presented, taken specifically by distinguished Chinese artists. More than half of the art pieces are made on–site by GU Zhen, LUO Yongjin, YANG Zhenzhong, YANG Fudong, etc, The History & Culture Exhibition focuses on buildings on Tianping street, in particular those designed by Alexandre Leonard. Celebrities of Tianping Street will showcase local celebrities and their life scenes in the form of culture salon where modern community activities will be included. Brand Introduction

As never-fading memories of its residents, icons epitomize, inherit and carry on the culture of a city. Shanghai, with its history of over seven centuries, boasts a variety of icons, which constitute an organic part of Shanghainese culture and the indispensable spiritual backbone for its progress.

Hosted by Shanghai Urban Planning Exhibition Center, "Iconic Shanghai" focuses on the historical landscapes of the city. 

Sculptures created by young artists have developed into an unneglectable and powerful youth trend that dictates what sculptures are today and where they are heading. The prosperity of sculpture world is determined by its youngest members. Aiming to promote creation of young artists and focusing on their development, the Graduates and Undergraduates' Outstanding Visual Public Artwork Exhibition of National Art plays a major part in forming this "youth trend".

The "youth trend" is by no means accidental. It reflects a major transformation of contemporary art scenarios and fundamental landscape of sculpture as an industry.

The Internet era has changed the way that information is communicated, and "matrixized" the way that art, especially sculpture, news travels, which used to be "linear". Now that students are empowered with new channels and modes to receive messages, their creative efforts enjoy broader vision and an enrich library of reference.

Young sculpturists are particularly sensitive to learn and command new concepts, materials and techniques. Their creative activities and mindsets are more liberal. These factors all undergird and promote innovativeness.

Another beneficial factor contributing to this youth trend is the general public's appreciation and support, including education reform, media coverage, regularized exhibitions, and even an emerging market. All these elements help create a youth-friendly atmosphere.

Despite its advantage as a new movement, the youth trend needs to confront the society, the history of art. It needs accumulation, adjustment and enhancement. Thus the biennale shoulders a dual mission as a showcase and a place for self–promotion. That's how this exhibition stands out from all others of the same category in China, where its uniqueness lies, and what we are determined to carry on.





Theme Interpretation

In response to the general concept of SUSAS 2017, "thisConnection: Sharing a future public space", the curators choose "Cycle" as its theme. Besides enhancing contemporary urban public life, the theme highlights the core of Oriental wisdom: reciprocal, sustainable development of Human, Nature and Society. As the ongoing wave of global urban renewal emphasizes the culture of one's "own", a significant trend of future urban public spaces is to construct a connected, fused system of nature, technology and art. In embodying the eastern perspective of life and world that features co-existence and mutual prosperity of humans and their dwelling, the "Cycle" is predictably going to be an essential idea of cultural revitalization in this ancient nation. It betokens an Oriental poetic dwelling as the way that future urban public spaces should step on.

In the past three decades, starting from non–existence, Chinese contemporary art has evolved from copying Western counterparts to derivation, and finally to original creation. Generations of artists have struggled to break away with established paradigms, conceptual, nomenclatural or methodological. Their experiments target at formal, cultural, conceptual, methodological and even more aspects of arts, giving birth to a treasure of contemporary artworks reflecting the contemporary Chinese cultural spirit. To effectively demonstrate the latest fruit of such art innovations, the hosts have curated a most representative set of artists and their works, offering an all–covering dialogue between East and West. Topic: our era of "Pan–Painting".

Thus, the exhibition presents a variety of categories, such as synthetic material painting, oil painting, Tempera, print, mural, among others; the entire spectrum of painting language from concrete, expressive to abstract; and all kinds explorations concerning the possibilities of medium in contemporary art. The exhibition has three parts. The first is synthetic material painting that represents the highest professional standards in China. The second puts on show a collection of contemporary visual artworks, covering oil painting, print and ink and wash. The last part is reserved to specific invited painters, mostly Shanghai school.

Theme Interpretation

Considering the statue of ferry as public infrastructure, the planning team of The Bund Art Project 2017 integrates publicity and participatory elements for citizens or visitors into the theme.

Given the actual condition of ferries, the curators set a twofold target for the competitors: enhance the appearance and security of the public transportation. The project rethinks the boundaries of contemporary art and design, and demonstrate aesthetic notions to an untrained audience in a visual-oriented way.

Based on the fact that ferry travels through both space and time, the façade is the region that calls for renovation. The concept aims to express the prosperity, tolerance, romance, colorfulness and sophistication of Shanghai as an international metropolis.

"Ferry Love" is the consistent theme of this ferry renovation program, where "ferry" indicates the object to which the project applies, and "love" tells the core of the whole thing.

As the Greek philosopher, Heraclitus, says, No man ever steps in the same river twice, since the river never stops flowing, and therefore changing for even a second. The intentionality towards flowing embodies the varying relationship between human and city.

Huangpu River carries the ferry, and the ferry carries man. Ferry is not single dimensional, neither is life. The city "objectifies" humans. Essentially, a human is alien to another. One is related to another as if an automata. The sense of security derives from the attempt to approach a group of people, and aligning to them in terms of thought, emotion and action. Despite the universal inclination towards each other, loneliness, insecurity, fear and feeling of guilt persist. Had there been no connections, no intersections, there would be no understanding. A frictionless world is one with no place of comprehension. As a converging point of flowing crowds, ferries always stay on the river. Dynamic relationship find rest there, and they thus initiate the process of love. Interestingly, the ferry, the vehicle is far from stable, but runs on an equally flowing waterway, which insinuates that ferry and love are merely starting points, or processes, but never the ends.



Project Introduction

The topic of SUSAS 2017: thisConnectionSharing a future public space is how, in the process of urbanization, links broken for various reasons are transformed into continuous, open, comfortable and accessible public spaces in the future. Lingang New City is a satellite town geographically distant from the metropolitan, so the issue of shortening the distance, physically or conceptually with Shanghai is of particular interest concerning the future form of this area. We have invited a number of outstanding architectural teams, including Archi-Union &i-zou Technology, Naturalbuild and Run Atelier as partner exhibitors, and fill large-scale holes and ravines with small constructions, which function as "connections" in public spaces. What's more, the design creates a model for comfortable, accessible public space of future, and interprets the multi-level interaction between human and context in future spaces. We also invited a number of young architects, such as ShuiYanfei& Ma Yuanrong& Su Yiqi (Naturalbuild), Fan Beilei& Kong Rui (genarchitects), Wang Yan (GOA) and Li Danfeng& Zhou Jianjia (YeAS), to distribute the more open ideas of space with which the younger generation depicts the landscape of future, in the form of models and documents. Besides, we will hold a forum on public art. A number of leading professionals around the world will be present, including Carme Pigem (RCR Arquitectes, Spain), Fernando Marquez Cecilia (editor of El Croquis, an architectural journal) and Zhang Yonghe (founder of Atelier FCJZ), discuss their diversified yet equally deep insights, and contribute their opinions on the future of Lingang New City and public spaces.
